


OIL FAST FACTS

- . Oil began forming hundreds of millions of years ago from decayed plants and animals. Rich deposits are found in the Middle East, Alaska and other places.
- 2. Four countries, Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Iran and Russia control 70% of the world's oil reserves.
- In 2000, the world used 76.6 million barrels of oil per day. In a year, that amounts to enough oil to fill a lake 10 miles long 9 miles wide and 60 feet deep.
- Oil supplies 40 percent of total U.S. energy needs. The U.S. is responsible for 25% of the worlds oil consumption.
- 5. The U.S. produces less than half of the oil it consumes.

 - 21 gallons of gasoline or
 - 3 gallons of jet fuel or

 - 4 gallons of lubricants


PETROLEUM & NATURAL GAS FORMATION
